Music and dance forms a fundamental part of Indian cultural heritage. This exhibition traces the story of these art forms, their cultural significance and the way they have been transformed by musicians and dancers practising in Britain.

Showcasing objects and instruments from the Horniman Museum, South Asian Diaspora Literature and Arts Archive (SALIDAA) and local community groups and artists, this colourful and vibrant exhibition looks at the significant influence of musicians and dancers from South Asia, in Britain.

In the Croydon NOW area of the Museum of Croydon discover a variety of musical instruments as well as instruments relating to different forms of Indian dance. You can also watch oral history interviews and video performances with key figures in the Indian music and dance movement in Britain. The Space C gallery displays a stunning variety of Indian dance costumes, depicting all the classical styles of Indian dance and three folk traditions. The Clocktower Café Gallery and Clocktower Court exhibit a range of photographs showing contemporary dancers as well as the origins and uses of instruments in their native India.

Accompanying the exhibition is a programme of events including family workshops, lectures and performances, exploring and celebrating Indian music and dance in Britain.

This exhibition is part of the Heritage Lottery Funded project 'String and Dance Festival', which is being run by the London Sitar Ensemble in association with the Museum of Croydon and Sutton Subrang.

Croydon Community Dance Groups present traditional and contemporary dance items.


